The purpose of this form

- 1.1 You should complete this form if you are applying for a Community Digital Sound Programme (C-DSP) licence.
- 1.2 A digital sound programme service intended for broadcast by means of a local or small-scale radio multiplex service requires either a C-DSP licence or a local DSP licence. Ofcom’s published guidance notes set out some of the key issues that potential applicants need to consider in deciding which type of licence is suitable for them. In summary, C-DSP services are not run for financial gain and are required to provide social gain. C-DSP licences therefore include strict conditions to ensure that happens and provide less flexibility than a local DSP licence. However, they do provide access to capacity that small-scale radio multiplex service providers are required to reserve solely for C-DSP services.
- 1.3 A C-DSP licence will be required even if the same programme service is also provided on any other platforms (e.g. FM, satellite), as separate licences are required for those.
- 1.4 As noted above, small-scale radio multiplex services will have reserved capacity for C-DSP services. Issue of a C-DSP licence does not, however, guarantee carriage on a small-scale (or local) radio multiplex service. That is a matter for agreement between the C-DSP licensee and the multiplex service provider, and there may be more C-DSP licences issued in a locality than there are reserved slots on the small-scale radio multiplex service. Note that a C-DSP service does not necessarily have to broadcast using reserved capacity. It can use unreserved capacity on a small-scale radio multiplex service or capacity on a local radio multiplex service, again subject to agreement with the multiplex service provider.
- 1.5 An application for a C-DSP licence will be accepted only once Ofcom has advertised the licence for the small-scale radio multiplex service upon which the proposed C-DSP service is intended to be provided. There is no closing-date by which an application for a C-DSP licence must be submitted (i.e. it can be submitted at any time after the licence for the relevant small-scale radio multiplex licence has been advertised).

The service is financed by a mix of funding from grants and advertising revenue

Original launch was financed by means of support from National Lottery Awards for All for FM transmission and associated equipment. Studio equipment hardware and playout system software was supported by Renfrewshire Council Heritage Fund.

Ongoing operating expenses are financed through local trader advertising spots and sponsorship. There has also been revenue from grant funded community activities.

These funders include: Foundation Scotland Response Recovery & Resilience Fund, The Robertson Trust, Glasgow; The Corra Foundation, Edinburgh (was Lloyds TSB Foundation for Scotland) and Linstone Housing Association, Linwood.

The target area is as currently carried on the Ofcom Trial Glasgow Small-scale DAB radio multiplex. Paisley FM has been carried on this multiplex since December 2018.

The current area is basically the City of Glasgow area with some unavoidable overspill into natural close areas. The target community reflects the Ofcom Glasgow polygon map which has natural affinity with the analogue/FM transmission area.

- 3.6 How will you ensure that your proposed C-DSP service is run on a not-for-profit basis? The C-DSP DAB licence service is a simulcast of the Paisley FM 107.5 analogue programme service.

This is licenced by Ofcom CR102170 which has licence Key Commitments and run on a not-for-profit basis. The legal entity is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital, therefore no shareholders.

Paisley FM is also a registered charity with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR). Paisley FM charity registration number: SC049193. Registered on 3 April 2019.

Arrangements are in place as per the Ofcom Community Radio analogue licence for delivery of social gain objectives.

Social gain

The service provides a range of community benefits (social gain objectives mandated by statute) for the target community, both on-air and off-air, and in doing so, achieves the following objectives:

- the facilitation of discussion and the expression of opinion,
- the provision (whether by means of programmes included in the service or otherwise) of education or training to individuals not employed by the person providing the service, and
- the better understanding of the particular community and the strengthening of links within it.

Members of the target community contribute to the operation and management of the service.

The service has mechanisms in place to ensure it is accountable to its target community.

Recent examples of community benefit include social action activity:

The service supported **Talk Money Week 2020** from Monday 9 until Friday 13 November 2020. Social action activity included on-air interviews and information from guests in their specialist fields

The service received a ‘Thank You’ certificate and supporting letter from The Provost of Renfrewshire stating, “The Provost of Renfrewshire would like to give thanks and recognition to Paisley FM for their outstanding contribution to the community in the face of adversity during a global pandemic.” – dated September 2020.

The service teamed-up with **Glasgow Science Centre** to present **The Spark of Science** on weeknights. This activity included interviews and short science sound bites to spark imagination and curiosity.

Currently, in association with RAMH – **Recovery Across Mental Health** – the service is running an extensive help, advice and information campaign with members of RAMH involved in the delivery of the social action.

The service launched **The Paisley FM Radio Academy** in June 2019 to provide Scottish Qualification Authority (SQA) courses in Radio Broadcasting for pupils in schools across Renfrewshire.

This course is a SCQF level 5 Media Unit to enable them to develop the skills and techniques to allow them to make speech-based radio programmes. SCQF – the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework is the national credit transfer system for all levels of qualifications in Scotland.

There are also weekly features to include **Health Matters** with a Health Centre Practice Nurse on topical health issues, help and advice. **Citizens Advice Bureau** with advice and information on a range of topics in association with Renfrewshire CAB. **Legal Matters** with a firm of Glasgow city centre solicitors.

The service is broadcasting COVID-19 Public Service Announcements provided by the Scottish Government. These are updated at least weekly when the Scottish Government First Minister makes new statements.

A significant project to facilitate discussion and expression of opinion was during the UK General Election on 12 December 2019.

The service organised a Hustings Event whereby all prospective candidates from all political parties were invited and took part. The Hustings took place on 26 November 2019 at The Bungalow venue with a full attendance.

The intention is to do similar Hustings events for the Scottish Government Election of MSPs in May 2021.

There have been many guests from all walks of life that have had discussions and opinions including the local MPs and MSPs plus Renfrewshire Councillors aired during the past year.

- 3.9 How will you ensure that members of your target community(ies) can gain access to the facilities used to provide your service, and receive training in using these? In particular, please set out how this will be done practically, formally and/or informally. Answer **in fewer than 400 words**.

As previously stated, The Paisley FM Radio Academy launched in June 2019 to provide Scottish Qualification Authority (SQA) courses in Radio Broadcasting and Wider Development for pupils in schools.

Not only school pupils, but adults are invited to gain access to the facilities.

In practice, this occurred at the start of the Coronavirus pandemic in March 2020, when through grant awards, equipment was made available to various community groups to enable them to record interviews and produce announcements to make the public more aware of the help and advice available to all people.

Members of the target community have become involved with the service, received training and access to enable programme making. Programming, engagement and involvement is developing all time to include BAME Glasgow and Paisley groups, Paisley Community Trust Community Chat Show which is scheduled on a Thursday.

- 3.10 How will your service provide better understanding of your target community and the strengthening of links within it? **Answer in fewer than 200 words.**

The service is proactive in the community and is a member of various organisation and attends regular meetings and briefings within the Third Sector.

These organisations include Engage Renfrewshire, Citizens Advice, Linstone Housing, Star Project, Greater Glasgow & Clyde Health Service, Chamber of Commerce plus community councils and councillors.

The members of the service have since June 2019 been involved with the delivery of non-broadcast activities, principally with the SQA (Scottish Qualification Authority) and Renfrewshire Education.

From August 2020, pupils started their Paisley FM SQA Course in Media and practical and transferable skills.

Participation

The target community are given opportunities to participate in the operation of the service.

This includes people from around Paisley, Renfrewshire and Glasgow getting involved in programme making to include news and sport reports.

There is a team of six people involved with delivering local news and sports bulletins and special features. Morning and afternoon locally produced news and sport bulletins on the half-hour are scheduled Monday to Friday. At weekends, locally produced sports bulletins are produced and schedule for Saturday and Sunday morning until 10.30am.

There are local people involved in the arts and performance with various Arts Centres producing content, most notable for a virtual Sma' Shot Day event.

Glasgow Science Centre are also involved with content and education to include special features around events.

There are 34 members of the service and they have access to a private Facebook page to exchange views and provide feedback and information. There are also virtual meetings using Zoom for the development of the SQA education course.

Accountability

- 3.13 How will members of your target community contact your service and influence its operation? **Answer in fewer than 300 words.**

Members of the target community can make contact with the service in a variety of ways as indeed they do at present.

This includes by telephone to the studio and office; by email to the studio and admin office; using social media platforms to include Facebook and Twitter plus the website at paisleyfm.co.uk

This activity has been since the launch of the service in March 2019, some 21 months.

Suggestions are always welcome and thoroughly investigated to ascertain that a suggestion could become a reality.

There are examples of that with approaches from the target community to provide content and social action.

Most recently, Black Lives Matter is a case in point. The service became involved in a social action and awareness campaign during the BLM month in October 2020.

With PACE Drama Theatre for young people, the service got involved through Renfrewshire Council as part of the virtual Sma' Shot Day Parade 2020.

The service is run exclusively by volunteers from all sections of the community and therefore, no 'staff' members as such.

The Compliance Team has two members.

The intention is to train staff from our own resources and the published Codes. The service will also investigate resources from other services in the community sector.

The service is a member of the Community Media Association and a member of the UK Community Radio Network. This UK Network has Station Manager Meetings via Zoom every two weeks in which are attended virtually online. From these meetings compliance matters are discussed.

As Paisley FM is an existing Ofcom licensed Community Radio service on analogue/FM we continue to keep up to date on compliance matters to include Ofcom Bulletins which includes listener and viewer complaints.

- 4.5 It is a licence requirement that a licensee must ensure that all programming on its service (broadcast at any time of the day or night) complies with Ofcom's codes and rules (e.g. Ofcom's Broadcasting Code, which sets requirements on standards to be observed in programme content for the protection of the public). As an existing Ofcom licensed community radio station broadcasting on 107.5 FM, Paisley FM takes compliance seriously.

Each month, a review of output and content, plus non-broadcast activity is undertaken to ensure Ofcom licence Key Commitments are observed and are per licence condition.
